for club use, which is really appreciated.



Good bye "lifr.org"...... Hello "liflyrodders.org"

It has been said that "All things, good and bad, must come to an end" and our original website, www.lifr.org is no exception.

The "old site" is almost 12 years old and, given the advancements in technology and web design, it kind of became old hat. Not only that, but since its inception, the site grew from a few files to an almost unmanageable number.

When I first decided to create a web page for our club almost 12 years ago, I knew absolutely nothing about web design. Much of what I did was trial and error. I added new features thinking that "more is better" only to find out that there was hardly any interest in some of them, so I removed them. These included free Buy-Sell postings for our members, free web-based email, on-line greeting cards and a Club Merchandise section among others. On the other hand, I like to think that some of the features that were added later on, like the "What's New", "Reflections" "Archives" and "Newsletter" sections turned out to be real winners.

As of at 2:20 PM, on January 16, 2011, LIFR.org was visited 66,062 times.

Now, it's time to give the old gal a permanent rest. A while back, Gordon Mueller graciously volunteered to take over the responsibility of "Webmaster" and, soon after that, embarked on a total re-design of our club's webpage. I personally think that Gordon has done a heck of a job designing a truly professional looking website.


The guest judges, Keith Fulsher and Jim Krul and his son picked Lee Weil's creation as the winner.

Fish bus

Berkley has a program for recycling **used fishing line**. If you call them and you are **a business**, they will send you a shipping box

(prepaid) to send in the line. Their only stipulation is that the line be clean and free of all debris, hooks, and metal attachments. Here's the Berkley number.

1-800-BERKLEY or 1-800-237-5539

If you are not a business and you have a bag of line, send it to the following address. Remember that birds and marine animals become entangled in fishing line. Do what you can. Make sure the line is clean of debris, hooks, and metal attachments.


