

Howie and I enjoyed Lee Weil's and Jeff Far-


rell's trip to Clarks Creek in PA.

#### The LIFR Crew At Clarks

After a sabbatical of 8 years we decided to reintroduce the Yellow Breeches spring trip to the LIFR schedule. While many of the members may be familiar with the Breeches from the late season Allenberry trips, I prefer to fish the area in the spring. There are fewer anglers and the weather is cooler, however, that being said, there is also the chance that the water levels will be high. For days prior to our arrival, over a week of rain had produced an angry, almost unfishable Yellow Breeches. Therefore it was time for Plan B, and we were happy to introduce the members to my favorite steam in PA, Clarks Creek. Clarks is located in Dauphin county, and while substantially smaller than the Breeches, it holds plenty of fish and most important it was clearly (no pun intended) in better shape after the torrential rain that we drove down in.

Once we got to the stream the rain guit and we found Clarks to be wadeable, albeit offcolor. That didno prevent Cliff Dies from taking the first fish on his first cast, guided by Jeff Farrell. Shortly afterward, Al Battistelli landed a native, and others took fish on the usual fare for high, stained water. the old faithful buggers and bright colored Moosehead Belle streamers.

While we were fishing Clarks, Howie and Susan Solomon were off scouting Laurel Run, a native brookie steam recommended by Emily

at the Yellow Breeches Outfitters. When we all met up for dinner at the Market Cross English Pub (with over 200 kinds of beer!) they convinced us to join them the next day and check it out for ourselves.

In the morning the convoy made it s way south to Newville and found Laurel Run to be very appealing. While most of the gang headed downstream, Bill and Sue Gordon took off upstream with Mac, their 4 legged fishing guide. He turned out to be a good one, since they did find bugs and feeding fish, while the rest of us headed back to Clarks. The water had already dropped a bit, and we were treated to some good dry fly fishing, with fish taken on Hendricksons, Black caddis and Sulphurs. That night the Rustic Tavern proved to be a winner, and we went back to our rooms stuffed, tired and happy.

The next morning those who stayed to fish were rewarded with some good fish on dry flys again, and all too soon it was time to head back north. Once again the Flyrodders prevailed against the forces of Mother Nature, and had a successful trip. Good friends, good food and good fishing; that s what our trips are all about.



Thanks to Bob Picciano, our video library has been upgraded from VHS to DVD. See Bob at the Monthly Meetings to borrow a title.



Berkley has a program for recycling used fishing line. If you call them and you are a business, they will send you a shipping box


(prepaid) to send in the line. Their only stipulation is that the line be clean and free of all debris, hooks, and metal attachments. Heres the Berkley number.

**Body:** Uni Stretch or any Floss, Orange **Thorax:** Super Brite Dubbing, Dark Olive


#### **Member's Comments:**
