
Well, we've made it through winter and spring is upon us once again. As you read this letter, trout season will






Our next club meeting, April 7, will be our Annual Open house and Used Tackle Sale. So, if you have any fly fishing tackle that you no longer use,

## For Your Nythphormation



Fly of the Month: The Halfback

Hook:	Nymph, 2X Long, # 8 - # 18	Abdomen:	Peacock Herl
Thread:	Brown 3/0	Wing Case:	Pheasant Tail
Tail:	Pheasant Tail	Thorax:	Peacock Herl
Rib:	Copper tinsel (thin)	Legs:	Pheasant Tail

This fly originated in Vancouver, and will imitate a wide variety of nymphs. It is comprised of two very effective natural materials, peacock and pheasant. The traditional rib is black thread, but I like to flash it up so I substituted copper tinsel. It can be weighted with wire wrap if desired. In small sizes it is an excellent dropper.



- 1. Measure pheasant tail fibers approx. ½ shank long and tie in as tail. Tie in tinsel.
- 2. Even the tips of 3 or 4 peacock herls and tie them in at tail. Wrap the herl around the thread to form a rope. Wrap forward approx. 2/3 of shank and tie off.
- 3. Wrap copper ribbing over peacock and tie off.
- 4. Select a long bunch of pheasant tail fibers and even the tips. Measure approx. one shank length from tips, then tie them down in front of peacock with tips pointing to the rear. Wrap over butts to help build thorax up to one eye's width from eye.
- 5. Repeat the peacock rope technique and wrap thorax. Bring pheasant wing case forward over thorax and tie down at eye. Divide tips and fold back and downward on each side to form legs. Tie off and whip finish. Cement head and wing case to reinforce.

## ELDRED FISHING TRIP JULY 26 – 27, SUNDAY & MONDAY

We have been running this trip four years in a row and it always turned out to be a nice trip every time. We caught a variety of fish – bass, big blue gills, big crappie, pickerel, as well as some nice trout. The accommodations were very good and the food was excellent.

Eldred is located approximately two-and-a-half hours from New York City and it is a pleasant ride. This is also a great trip to bring family and friends and to introduce children to fishing.

The cost of the trip is as follows: We have a boat package, which includes a room, double occupancy, and the use of a bass boat for \$135.00 tax included. If you do not want to enter the bass contest then the cost of a room, double occupancy, is \$96.00 tax included. If you share either package with someone it will cost you half the price. If you need an extra cot in the room the cost is an additional \$8.00. Gordon Mueller and Joe Caroleo are running the trip. If you are interested in going on the trip or need further information, please contact us at any membership meeting or call us.

On Sunday we will be fishing at a local lake. You can rent a row boat or fish from shore. You can also picnic or swim at the beach area. A pass for the day costs \$3.00 for nonresidents. You can also fish other local waters which are nearby. You have the Delaware River, Mongaup Pond and Rondout Reservoir. Early Monday morning we will have a bass fishing contest. As part of the package we will be using bass boats for the bass fishing contest.

Eldred has two large trout ponds. One pond is Catch and Keep. It is stocked with trout. You will have free access to this pond. Whatever trout you catch you keep but you must pay \$6.25 per pound for the trout. You can have your trout cleaned and packed in ice for your trip home. The cost for this service is fifty cents per fish. The other pond is Catch and Release. It is stocked with trout and big catfish. It is for fly fishing only, barbless hooks only. The cost for this pond is \$12.50 per person and you can fish all day.

They also have computerized gambling at the Monticello Raceway, which is only minutes away, if you want to try your luck.



If you are not a business and you have a bag of line, send it to the following address. Remember that birds and marine animals become entangled in fishing line. Do what you can. Make sure the line is clean of debris, hooks, and metal attachments.


