


the club has to offer.

Back to the Future

Natchaug River Camping Trip, Chaplin, Ct. April 29 – May 1, 2011

We will be checking in at the Nickerson Park Family Campground at 3:00 pm Friday April 29 & can check out at our leisure on Sunday May 1.

The Natchaug River is right at the campground and easily wadeable. There are also other rivers within driving distance.

The following equipment is recommended:

3 – 6 wgt fly rod, 9 ft. leader,5x -7x tippet Flies: march brown, Hendrickson, hornberg, pheasant tail nymph, gold rib hare's ear nymph, adams.

Price includes diner Friday and Saturday nights, breakfasts and pack-your-own lunches on Saturday and Sunday and campground costs. Additional expenses are a Connecticut fishing license (\$22. for 3 days or \$55. for the year. If eligible, remember to apply for your refund from last year.)

Per person charges: One adult per site = \$85., two adults per site = \$70., three adults per site = \$55. This is a private campground, and only one tent or camper is allowed per site.

All money is due by March 1. Only members in good standing will be permitted on trip.

YELLOW BREECHES & CLARKS CREEK TRIP

May 4th through 6th we will be traveling down to south central PA to fish the famous Yellow Breeches River and another one of our favorite streams, Clarks Creek in Dauphin County. This time of year one can experience excellent hatches, including Hendricksons and prolific caddis.

We will be arriving on Wednesday and leaving on Friday, thus avoiding the crowds, since the Yellow Breeches is very popular in spring.

Driving time is approximately 4 hours. Accommodations will be at the Quality Inn, located 3 miles east of Carlisle off Route I-81. The rate for a room is \$90.00 for double occupancy, which is \$45.00 per person, per night if shared. There is a bar and pool table in the hotel. Dinner one night will be by reservation, with the venue to be announced.

Non-resident 3 day licenses cost \$26.70, and you will also need a Trout Stamp, which will cost an additional \$9.70, totaling \$36.40. You can print out the application from the PA Fish & Game website, or stop at Cabelas in Hamburg and purchase one on your way down. It's a good excuse to stop in and they open at 8:00 a.m. (perfect timing.)

(prepaid) to send in the line. Their only stipulation is that the line be clean and free of all debris, hooks, and metal attachments. Here's the Berkley number.

If you are not a business and you have a bag of line, send it to the following address. Remember that birds and marine animals become entangled in fishing line. Do what you can. Make sure the line is clean of debris, hooks, and metal attachments.

Member's Comments:


