






This Month's Meeting: September 3, 2019

The Fly of the Month - September 2019 Trico Spinner





I just got back from a trip to the Farmington River hosted by Paul McCain of River Bay Outfitters. Great trip on a beautiful river! The hot flies were Trico Spinners in sizes 24, 26 and even smaller. Trico (it's most often pronounced TRY-co; technically, though, it's TREE-co) is the common name given to Tricorythodes mayflies, which hatch most abundantly in August on trout rivers from Maine to California. Minuscule flies like these can be difficult to tie, and even harder to tie on to the tippet. Several of us had considerable difficulty with that operation. Whether that difficulty came from diminished vision in our advanced years, playing football without a helmet, or from excessive self gratification, is irrelevant. The eyes on hooks that small are microscopic, and getting those flies tied on required near-surgical precision. I noticed quite a bit of squinting and a good deal of profanity when flies were being changed. A possible solution to that problem may be to tie small fly bodies onto larger emerger hooks. The overall length of a #20 emerger hook is roughly the same as a #24 dry fly hook. The hook eyes are larger, as well as the hook gap, which can only increase hook-ups.

The fly has only two elements in addition to the hook - black 70 denier thread, and hair from the foot of a snowshoe rabbit. Tim Flagler of Tightlines Productions has produced an excellent video showing just how to tie such a fly (https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=Mk1C2GfDWb8). The fly pictured above is the result of watching his video. Note: Calf tail and hair don't have the floatation qualities that snowshoe rabbit hair does which is key to this pattern. Polypropylene yarn will work as a substitute in a pinch, but it's hard to beat the snowshoe.
