The Fly of the Month - December 2019

The Serena





This fly was designed in honor of the newest member of our family- my beautiful grand-niece Serena. Her adorable pink cheeks were the inspiration for the cheeks on the bead head.

The fly is tied on a size 12 standard wet fly hook. It is recommended that the fly be tied in sizes 14 and 16 as well. The bead is a tungsten 1/8ö white bead. Several wraps of .015 lead-free wire were wound onto the shank to help stabilize the bead.

The thread is 70 denier UTC in hot pink. The õcheeksö are pink crystal flash. The flash extends down the shank under the body and extends into the tail. The tail itself is white Zelon. The body is Jamiesonøs Spindrift yarn in Oyster. The rib is black UTC wire. The collar is the pink tying thread with a small amount of Hi-Viz white dubbing at the back of the collar. The bead head can be coated with Head Cement or a UV Resin to protect the flash. Happy Tying!



Material Things by Lee Weil (Archive)

Now that the cold weather has slowed down our fishing and made the fly tying bench a more comfortable place to spend my spare hours, I find myself looking for new patterns to tie. One of my favorite places to õshopö is the Virtual Fly Box pattern index, with a plethora of fresh and saltwater patterns to choose from. Many of these flies can be adapted to use for both applications; for example, the saltwater foam Gurglers downscaled in size work excellent for bass and pickerel and tied another size down will take bluegill as well.

Another interesting way to expand your tying repertoire is to explore new substitutes for traditional materials. I discovered a very effective dubbing substitute while shopping for sweater yarns. I noticed a spool of translucent gray mohair-like yarn in a bargain bin for 99 cents so I tossed it in my basket. When I got home I threw it in my fly tying box and forgot about it. One day when I was tying Casual Dress nymphs I noticed that it had the same color and texture as muskrat, so I tied up a few with the yarn. They passed the density test in the bathroom sink and I began to use it in other patterns with much success. The information on the spool is written in French and I assume

it came from a Canadian source, but unfortunately I

havenøt seen it anywhere since.

Another versatile material is metallic thread on spools that can actually be used to sew with. This is slightly elastic and can be used with a bobbin. It comes in a multitude of useful colors such as red and pearl and makes excellent underbodies for Crazy Charlies, Serendipities and midge emergers. It can also be used as a substitute for Krystal Flash ribbing. I buy it in Joanneøs craft store on Old Country Road in Westbury.

Craft fur is an excellent substitute for soft bucktail streamer patterns. It has a translucent quality and takes marker pen decoration very well. The type I use comes in generous sheets and is very reasonably priced. Rug yarn can be used for everything from crawfish bodies to Caddis wings, and metallic braid can be ply-divided to be used as ribbing on nymphs and salmon flies.

There is no end to the possibilities so just use your imagination. You can save money and discover new ways to tie those old patterns. Start thinking outside the box and chances are you will start bumping into your fellow tyers at the local craft store, rummaging through the bargain bins.
