For Your Nymphormation

The Uncle Si

Im always looking to build a obetter mousetrapo, and in this case it was a better March Brown emerger. Iøm a big fan of the A& E series, õDuck Dynastyö. When I took a good look at this pattern it reminded me of Uncle Si Robertson, with his gray beard and ponytail, thus the name.

I believe the fish take this to be an large emerger. I like to fish it like a wet fly, and use short retrieves at the end of the swing. It as a relatively easy tie, and uses common materials, including mallard duck (of course!)



Hook 2X Streamer # 6 - # 12 Rib Copper Wire Thread Hareøs Ear Dubbing **Rusty Brown** Body Weight Wire (Optional) Peacock Herl Thorax Tail Mallard Flank Fibers Top Wing Mallard Flank Collar Hen Pheasant

- 1. Lay a thread base and wrap the weight wire 1/3 fore shank. Tie in a tail of mallard flank fibers.
- 2. Tie in wire for rib, and then dub body ¾ of shank. Wrap wire rib and tie off.
- 3. Create thorax by making a chenille out of peacock herl, leaving enough room behind the eye for wing and collar.
- 4. Tie mallard flank over top of thorax, Hornberg style. Tie in hen pheasant feather by the tip and wrap forward wet fly collar style to eye. Whip finish head and cement.


LIFR PHOTO CONTEST RULES

If you are not a business and you have a bag of line, send it to the following address. Remember that birds and marine animals become entangled in fishing line. Do what you can. Make sure the line is clean of debris, hooks, and metal attachments.


