
LIFR Fly of the Month

Few flies are likely to generate as much discussion as the Squirmy Worm. Those who oppose it contend that it it not even a fly, and consider it to be just a short step away from bait fishing. Those who favor it state that it represents annelids that wash into the rivers from streams after a rainfall, and therefore feel that it actually omatches a hatch. Out of curiosity I recently used one on the Connie and can attest to the fact that it does catch fish. Now before you make any rash judgements, I do not own a purple sparkle boat, and the only time I ever wore my baseball cap backwards was when I was a Catcher on a softball team years ago. Iom not going to officially state where I stand regarding this fly, but will post something on the LIFR Facebook page so that all and any opinions regarding it can be aired.

The Fly(?) is tied using 1/2 of a leg from a Squirmy Worm pack tied onto a size 12 or 14 scud hook. The worm is tied onto the hook with thread that matches the color of the worm used. Corresponding dubbing is spun onto the thread to prevent it from cutting through the rubber material. Dongt use crazy glue or even head cement on the fly as they will instantly dissolve the rubber.

The Speaker at the November General Meeting Tim Flagler has an excellent tutorial video for this fly on his YouTube channel Tightlines Video. Check it out Bubba!





If you are not a business and you have a bag of line, send it to the following address. Remember that birds and marine animals become entangled in fishing line. Do what you can. Make sure the line is clean of debris, hooks, and metal attachments.


