Stefano. Thanks to all who participated and made the day a success.


We had our last "Tuesday at Friday's" fly tying night and we're now ready to try out all the patterns we've been tying during the winter. If anyone has

I'm on the bow of the boat like a soldier at his post, eyes scanning for any unusual activity. I'm constantly examining the aqua marine water for bonefish, but even with my polarized glasses, I am unable to see the target. I see starfish, stingrays, lemon shark, turtles and barracuda, but I can not see the bones. For that, I have to rely on my guide, who is poling the boat while perched on a platform above. I am standing there for what seems an eternity, poised; fly in hand, ready to cast at the sound of a command. All of a sudden, I hear it, "Bonefish at 10:30". "Bonefish *when?*" I say to myself, "where the Hell is 10:30?" Then I hear, "he's gone". OK, now I know the hands of the clock (and that 10:30 is between 10 and 11). I wait again. Now I hear, "Bonefish at 2 o'clock". I cast to the point I think would be 2 o'clock on my watch. Then I hear, "strip, strip, stop, long strip". All this is happening in seconds while my heart is pounding and my knees are shaking. I feel a strong pull on the line and I set the hook. That sets off a tug o' war between me and the bonefish. I let him run, I reel him in, he takes out more line, I reel it in. I wonder if he can be as nervous as I am. In the end, he tires before I do and I land my first bonefish. What a rush!

Howie and I were in South Andros, Bahamas where we spent a week fighting – bonefish, that is. We traveled with club members Gil Padovani, John Gerbitz, Linda Macy and Joe Otterstedt and Linda and Jerry Bottcher and Nancy Murphy from *The Hungry Trout*. Our days were packed with fishing adventures and in the evenings we laid back and enjoyed the solitude of South Andros and its friendly people. Our experience included island cuisine from conch to kingfish. We were made to feel welcome every place we went and learned to love the tranquility as much as the magnificent blue water. It's really true what they say, "It's better in the Bahamas".

INTRODUCTION TO FLY FISHING



(prepaid) to send in the line. Their only stipulation is that the line be clean and free of all debris, hooks, and metal attachments. Here's the Berkley number.

If you are not a business and you have a bag of line, send it to the following address. Remember that birds and marine animals become entangled in fishing line. Do what you can. Make sure the line is clean of debris, hooks, and metal attachments.


