






This Month's Meeting: October 2, 2018

October Fly of the Month - by Bill Smith

"The Usual"

The Usual is an excellent fly that was designed by the late Fran Betters. Fran was a famous Adirondack Fly Fishing Guide, Author, and Fly Tier. Fran also designed the Haystack, Ausable Well, and other classic flies.

Frances original recipe for the Usual called for grey thread, but he often tied it with Fluorescent Fire Orange thread (as seen on the left). It get fished this fly with great results on the Connetquot, but since we are on the verge of winter I thought Icpl try it with a Fluorescent Blue thread (photo on the right). The thinking here being that white and blue are classic winter fly colors. The Snowshoe Rabbit fur is translucent when wet, allowing the thread underneath to show through. All of the fur is taken from the underside of a Snowshoe Rabbit foot. The under hair is pulled out from the base of a clump of hair cut from the foot and put aside to be dubbed onto the fly later. I prefer to use the split-thread dubbing method for the body, but you should use whatever method you prefer.

Hook: Standard Dry Fly Hook #12-16, **Thread:** Fluorescent Blue 70 Denier,

Wing and Tail: Snowshoe Rabbit Foot guard hair, Snowshoe Rabbit Foot under hair







If you are not a business and you have a bag of line, send it to the following address. Remember that birds and marine animals become entangled in fishing line. Do what you can. Make sure the line is clean of debris, hooks, and metal attachments.


