
The November meeting is your final chance

What's In YOUR Vest?

Just recently my sister Deedee discovered (to my great joy) the magic that is fly fishing. She called me to ask what items she would need to stock the brand new vest she got for her birthday. I gave it some thought and decided to do an inventory of my own vest and list what I was currently carrying around. Throughout the years I made an honest effort to downsize and figured I was down to the bare essentials.

I grabbed a pen, listed the contents and mailed it off to her the next day. When she received the letter she must have been very excited, because I came home to a phone message from her asking just what I had been drinking. Apparently she was slightly overwhelmed by the assortment of paraphernalia I indicated was necessary to embark on a day on the stream. Now, I dong consider myself a gadget monkey, and I can do a full day on the Hudson with a chest pack, a bottle of water and a granola bar, but when I wear a vest I like to have everything I might need close at hand.

I also subscribe to the theory that fishing vests are like pocketbooks; the more room you have, the more crap you carry. Less pockets, less crap. So when I changed from my super sized vest to a shorty version I lost about 30 percent of my storage space. Ouila! A vest that weighed a lot less and allowed me to wade another 3 ‰ deeper (which is a lot more important than yourd think when youge 4d11+).

So here is my version of a list of essentials for a trout vest:

Leaders and tippet spools (4X through 8X), Dry fly box, Terrestrial box, Streamer box, Nymph box, Midge box, Biostrike indicator putty (2 colors), Loon sink putty, Orvis Mud, Frog Fanny powder, Loon float gel, forceps, nippers, stream thermometer, Spud eyeglass cleaner, Bug repellent, bandanna, hook hone, bandaids, matches, a whistle, compass, license holder, aspirin, Benadryl (for bee stings), tape measure, and a 35 mm.film container for tippet scraps.

Other than changing the fly boxes for different destinations the vest remains the same. The D ring on the back carries my net, and the back pocket carries my rain jacket. After all, I am a Long Island Flyrodder and have learned to expect rain every time there are more than 2 of us in a ½ mile radius. Maybe my sister can omit the rain jacket when shees not fishing with us. She may not need to carry 2 kinds of fly float, or a tape measure, however she has already exhibited that ugly trait of a typical angler by comparing her 18+ rainbow to every other fish picture I send her. Hopefully after a few years this %BOO YA!+dance will lose its attraction, but I seriously doubt it.

What I am really looking forward to is doing an inventory of the crap in HER vest in about five vears.

Caleb Smith State Park

The Fly Fishing season at Caleb Smith State Park will be extended four (4) weeks the past the usual ending date of October 15, as result of being closed approximately four (4) weeks for repairs due to damaged from Tropical Storm Irene:

The Fly Fishing Schedule and Procedures for Extended Season are as follows:

Dates: Starts: Sunday, October 16th 2011 Ends: Sunday, November 13th 2011

Park Closed: Mondays and Tuesdays

Fly Fishing Sessions:

1. Cost: \$20.00 per Person 2. One (1) session per day

- **3.** Sign-In Starts at: **7:30 a.m.** Time you should arrive at the Park. South Side Gate will remain <u>Locked</u> until just before sign-in starts)
- 4. Session time is from: 8:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m., Five (5) hours (you must leave the river and return to your vehicles at 1:00 p.m.)

Reservations:

- 1. One site per person; if only one (1) site is available we do allow two (2) people to fish one site at \$20.00 per person.
 - 2. A person can make a reservation for him or herself and one (1) additional fisherman/woman **ONLY!**

If you and/or your partner can't keep a reservation for whatever reason; you must call to cancel your reservation the night before or by 5:30 a.m. the morning of, so it can be utilize by other Fisherman/woman. As is our standard policy; if you and/or your partner fail to cancel a reservation you may forfeit the ability to utilize and/or make any future reservations for the remainder of the season.

All other standard rules and regulations as it relates to Possession Limit (2), Fish Size, Type of Tackle and Barbless hooks, etc are still in effect. Please call me, if you have any questions or concerns.






